

Year 5

In this half term, in History, we will be learning about the ancient civilisation of Baghdad in AD 800. We will begin by looking at what made their culture and civilisation important. Then, we will compare them with other civilisations of similar time periods and investigate how this incredible city has changed over the last thousand years.

Maths

We will begin the half term continuing with our learning on decimals and introducing percentages. Following this, we will look at calculating the perimeter and area of compound shapes and apply this knowledge to problem solving situations. Finally, we will look at statistics involving solving problems related to timetables and graphs.

In Computing, the children will be applying the skills they have learnt over the past two years about Scratch to design and make their own game.

In French, we will finish our Clothes topic and will design and talk about their own outfit.

In Science, continue to look at how humans grow and develop and we will move on to study plants and how they reproduce. When working scientifically, we will focus on recording data in various different ways.

In PE we will be further developing our gymnastics skills and will begin to look at striking and fielding in Cricket lessons.

In PSHE, we will look at economic well-being, including how to manage finances and we link this our Maths work so that we understand how to be financially savvy!

In English, The children will be looking at the famous Shakespeare play of Romeo and Juliet. We will delving into the story and using it as inspiration to create our own playscripts. The children will be exploring poetry and using it as inspiration for different writing and links to other cross-curricular subjects.
